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It comes with the territory...

“God is faithful, through whom you were called into fellowship with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.” (1 Corinthians 1:9)

When family members hurt us or leave, we are called to increase our love. Jesus paid a high price for love and as His disciples, we stand ever ready to accept gracefully the hurts that come with love—without complaining. It comes with the territory of Jesus' cross.

Consider the Lord's Supper. It focuses on the painful cross where Christ demonstrated His love for sinners by taking our sins upon Himself. Yet, His painful sacrifice results in deeper communion (fellowship) within the family of God. But it's not a free pass around pain. Never allow your hurt to become an excuse for letting go of your love.
