

LUKE 22:19



“...for you”

As the Passover holiday drew near, Jesus knew his life would be in danger in Jerusalem. He headed there anyway. On the way, He told the twelve, “Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be delivered to the chief priests and the scribes; and they will condemn Him to death and will hand Him over to the Gentiles.” (Mark 10:33)

When they arrived, Jesus did not play it safe. He entered the temple and drove out those who were buying and selling, overturning tables and accusing the merchants of turning a house of prayer into a robber’s den (Mark 10:17).

Instead of making plans to escape the danger, Jesus made plans to eat the Passover with his disciples, including the one who was about to betray Him. He said, “I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer.” (Luke 22:15).

When they reclined at the table, Jesus took the cup and gave thanks (Luke 22:17) before sharing it with the others. He also gave thanks for the bread, saying, “This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me.” (vs. 19). Then, after eating, Jesus took up the cup again saying, “This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood.” (Luke 22: 20). Twice, Jesus used the phrase, **“for you.”**

Jesus knew a disciple was about to betray Him and the authorities were about to kill Him. He knew His body was about to be given up and His blood poured out. Yet, He was unselfishly grateful. Why?

Everyone in the upper room knew that the Passover celebrated a deliverance from slavery, but not all understood the nature and extent of the new deliverance that Jesus’ death represented. Jesus did. His use of the phrase, “for you” explains why He headed for Jerusalem in the first place. JMS
